Rushen Players entered two plays – 'Lucy In the Sky' by Tony Layton, with four accomplished female performances and a best actress nomination for Lisa Murray, this play secured a third place in the adult section. Unfortunately, because of other commitments there might not be time to present this again in the foreseeable future.

And:- the two hander by Harold Pinter, 'The Lover'. This, however, can be enjoyed again on Thursday evening, 27th March at the EAC. Both Nicky Merritt & Ged Power are excellent and I'm sure Pinter fans will be well pleased (they also received best actor/actress nominations). This can be enjoyed alongside 'Marry Me' an original play by Shawn Sturnick presented by Preposterous Theatre for which they were awarded a well-deserved second place in the Adult competition. Both play and players were highly commended and the Adjudicator recommended that he enter the play for the Geoffrey Whitworth Playwriting Competition.
